

# Evaluation of Poster and teaching aid.

When writing the poster, I found it difficult to find the correct information. I did manage to find it with the help of my referenced books and Workbook 6, along with some websites for specific statistics for my graphs. If I were to do it again, I would try to make the text simpler to understand, as a couple of feedback comments were that there is a lot of text. In doing this, it would have been easier to understand and find the information for my teaching aid.

I also would have changed the layout, alternatively I would have used a different programme to create it. Although I was able to fit all the information on there it looked a bit squashed and not very well thought out. I would have used a programme that allows larger document sizes as well, due to the layout I wasn't sure of how or if all of my text boxes would fit correctly. This resulted in having to split the title up and place it on either side of the upper boxes, making it not as obvious, if I had kept it together, the title would have been visible as a title, rather than what looks like some random words.

On the other hand, I had received some good feedback about the teaching aid. I had included questions/ answers from the poster, as well as a couple that aren't found in the poster to try and really test everyone in the class. Along with this, the other good feedback I received was about my use of graphs and diagrams. Regarding the diagrams, specifically the Electron shell configurations, I would have liked to have created these myself, however as the number of electrons was going up, this was becoming increasingly difficult to make them look good, so I used an internet resource to get them (all references are available in bibliography).

If I were able to redo this project, I would certainly use better materials to have a sturdier, poster. I would also try to think of a better more complex game, as a simple crossword seems a miss where there are so many more teaching aids available to create. I would also attempt to organise the material that I needed in a more manageable fashion, as the completed product was fairly disorganised and a bit rushed.
